CARD 1

Ethical practice

Business decisions and actions that are fair, honest, responsible and respectful of workers, customers, communities and the natural environment.

CARD 2

Global ethical practice

Applying responsible standards to operations, supply chains, production, employment, marketing and environmental impact across different countries.

CARD 3

The three ethical practice areas in this dotpoint

Minimum standards of labour by the ILO, corporate social responsibility, and environmental sustainability.

CARD 4

International Labour Organisation (ILO)

A United Nations agency created in 1919 that sets international labour standards and promotes decent work.

CARD 5

ILO Convention No. 138

The ILO Minimum Age Convention, adopted in 1973, generally sets 15 as the minimum age for work and 18 for hazardous work.

CARD 6

Child labour

Work that is unsuitable for children because it can harm their health, safety, education, development or wellbeing.

CARD 7

Global child labour fact

Around 138 million children worldwide are still involved in child labour, equal to almost 8% of all children.

CARD 8

Minimum standards of labour

Basic labour expectations such as no child labour, no forced labour, safe work, fair treatment and fair conditions.

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CARD 9**ILO labour standards - business response**

Use supplier codes of conduct, supplier audits, age verification, supply chain tracing and corrective action plans.

CARD 10**Corporate social responsibility**

A business taking responsibility for the impact of its decisions on stakeholders, including employees, customers, suppliers, communities and the environment.

CARD 11**CSR - impact**

CSR can improve reputation, customer loyalty, employee morale, community support and stakeholder trust.

CARD 12**CSR - business response**

Create CSR policies, support local communities and report transparently on labour, community and environmental practices.

CARD 13**Environmental sustainability**

Business practices that reduce harm to the natural environment and help preserve resources for the future.

CARD 14**Environmental sustainability - impact**

It can affect sourcing, manufacturing, packaging, transport, waste, energy use and tourism practices.

CARD 15**Environmental sustainability - business response**

Use sustainable sourcing, reduce waste, improve energy efficiency and lower emissions across operations.

CARD 16**Why incorporate ethical responsibility?**

It helps protect reputation, meet stakeholder expectations, reduce risk and support long-term business success.
